"A very high percentage of our students will attend college. With this in mind, we offer the following statements that reflect what high school students can do to increase or improve their chances for success in college:

- 1. A determined effort should be made to make the best grades possible in high school.
- 2. Acquiring attitudes and habits of self-reliance are an invaluable asset of the college-bound high school student.
- 3. Acquiring habits of self-control in the classroom: Colleges will not tolerate behavior that is disruptive to learning.
- 4. Acquiring habits of self-control in the management of money.
- 5. Acquiring habits of self-control in the budgeting of time wisely in regard to study and extra-curricular activities.
- 6. Development of good study habits.
- 7. Adherence to good habits of desirable physical and mental hygiene.

FRENCH CLUB NEWS



A group of French students from Vermilion Catholic High School in Abbeville, Louisiana are participating a unique educational cultural exchange with a high school in Abbeville, France. At the end of May, VC French teacher Judy Lapeyrouse and a group of her students traveled to France to participate in the first half of an exchange with Saint Pierre Catholic High School in Abbeville. The students visited many historical and cultural sites. The students attended a memorial service on Memorial Day at the World War I American Cemetery in Belleau. In a gesture of unity, the students laid a wreath from the two schools from both Abbevilles. The students visited several sites in the city of Abbeville, including the former Capuchin monastery where Père Megret (the founder of Abbeville, Louisiana) studied before coming to Louisiana. Other excursions included visiting the Somme Bay and rocky beaches on the northwestern coast of France, the Abbey of Riquier, the Cathedral of Amiens (where they saw the skull of St. John the Baptist), and the Château of Chantilly.
