

Financial Information

- Operating budget = \$4,462,553
- Average amount to educate one student = \$8,550
- Teacher salaries are currently 15-20% lower than Vermilion parish public school teachers with their same level of education and experience. Tuition and fees does not currently cover the operating costs of the VC educational experience. The average cost to educate a student at Vermillion Catholic is approximately \$8,500, while tuition and fees per level is currently well below that amount. That leaves a shortfall each year, which is why the work of Booster Club, Development, and the Advancement Departments is so important. We encourage all parents, grandparents, alumni, and friends to continue to support all fundraisers and consider Planned Giving to invest in our students and keep our legacy alive.



Curriculum Department

- Upper School
 - 82 % of our graduating senior class are expectant TOPS recipients
 - 26 students went to State Rally due to our District Rally being canceled and 6 students placed in the top 3 of their category
 - One student was the overall winner of all rally participants in English III
- · Middle School
 - Washington DC trip was brought back for Middle School students to expand their curriculum to real world travel
 - Data from Standardized testing has helped to better align core curriculum
 - New BETA students were invited to attend convention along with participating students
- Lower School
 - Our PreK-3 curriculum underwent a significant revamp, and our data clearly shows that our "little eagles" made substantial academic, social, and emotional gains.
 - In our primary grades (PreK-2), we implemented supplemental phonemic awareness and phonics programs to complement our Wonders curriculum. Data indicates that students have benefited tremendously from this combined approach, especially when paired with highly effective teaching practices.
