Dear Parents of Incoming 6th - 12th graders for the 2026-2027 school year,

Children acquire news skills throughout the school year, but they can lose ground if learning stops during the summer break. Fortunately, learning never has to stop. Children who read throughout the summer gain skills and develop a better understanding of language and the world around them. Vermilion Catholic students entering grades 6-12 for the 2026-2027 school year **are required to read at least one AR book during the summer.**

### **Summer Reading Requirements and Guidelines:**

All students in these grade levels will be required to take an AR test on ONE book they read over the summer. They will take this test during their scheduled ELA class during the second week of school. This AR test will be the first grade for their ELA class. Here are a few guidelines to help you help your child choose the right book this summer:

- The book must be worth at least 4 AR points.
- The book must have a reading level of 4.0 or higher.

Allow your child to choose the books he or she reads. Studies have shown the benefits of choice in reading development. Expose your child to a wide variety of reading materials, but let him or her be the final decision-maker.
